A GOOD COLLEAGUE AND AN EXCELLENT FRIEND

Back in January of 2018, Dr. John Salvesson came to be our Minister of Music / Organist and has blessed our lives ever since with his fine musicianship, his deep faith and his kind thoughtfulness in all he did. Addressing the first two stanzas to the singers of the hymn and the last three to God, this free paraphrase of Psalm 104 recasts the psalmist's imagery with baroque verve. Though it was first published in England, the tune has been more popular in North America than there.
