Praying Through Lent: Pick Up the Psalter

One of the most prevalent complaints I receive from folks is in regard to their prayer life. For most, a 'prayer life' is non-existent. There seems to be no time in their busy schedules to sit and pray. They may attempt to do so while commuting to work, but find the distractions of being in the midst of traffic causes their minds to wander.

Or, for some, time may be set aside, but they feel that they either have little to say to God or that their prayers become routine, repetitive and mainly focused upon their own concerns. These walk away from prayer finding it shallow or meaningless primarily because the focus is always upon their own thoughts and desires.

I have found the very same complaints in my own life of prayer. Most of the time, I feel way too distracted to pray about much of anything. The clock is merciless when it comes to finding some time alone or in quietude. Also, there have been times when I have realized that the only things for which I pray are those things which concern me directly or those whom I love. In those dry spells, it does feel quite meaningless and futile to pray.

But this is not what Christ intended for us when he said: 'This, then, is how you should pray ...' With that short sentence in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus introduces his disciples to the prayer that we have come to know as the Lord's Prayer. Certainly, Jesus intends his followers to offer themselves to God in prayer. Just how do we do this in a truly meaningful and disciplined way? I would suggest to anyone interested that reading through the Book of Psalms (also called the Psalter), is a good exercise in learning to pray. Many of the psalms are actually prayers or calls to prayer.

When you're feeling 'stuck' in your prayer life, pick up the Book of Psalms and begin to read ... this too is an act of prayer.




"Lenten Prayer Practices"




